

Volunteer Opportunity: Presentations and Workshops

We regularly are invited or ask schools and community groups to run a workshop or give a presentation on various climate change and carbon-related topics, such as our popular 'Carbon Conversations Taster'. They are often specialised to suit a particular group's needs and interests.

Giving a workshop or presentation means:

- Travelling to the site of a workshop or presentation with materials and, with another volunteer, giving a talk to a small group of people.

It needs someone who:

- Is a great communicator, comfortable talking in front of small groups of people.
- Is interested in helping to raise awareness, share knowledge and help people gain real tools for reducing their carbon footprint.
- Wants to delve deeper into the issues with people than is possible on stalls.
- Has completed Carbon Conversations.
- Can take a three session training course in 'How to run Workshops and Presentations.' If you already have a lot of experience in this area get in touch, you may be able to volunteer with our outreach group without doing the training.
- Can travel around Cambridge, be on time and reliable. Being available during the day is not necessary but definitely helpful for us to know.

- Planning and preparing the workshops and talks alongside other volunteers/ staff.
