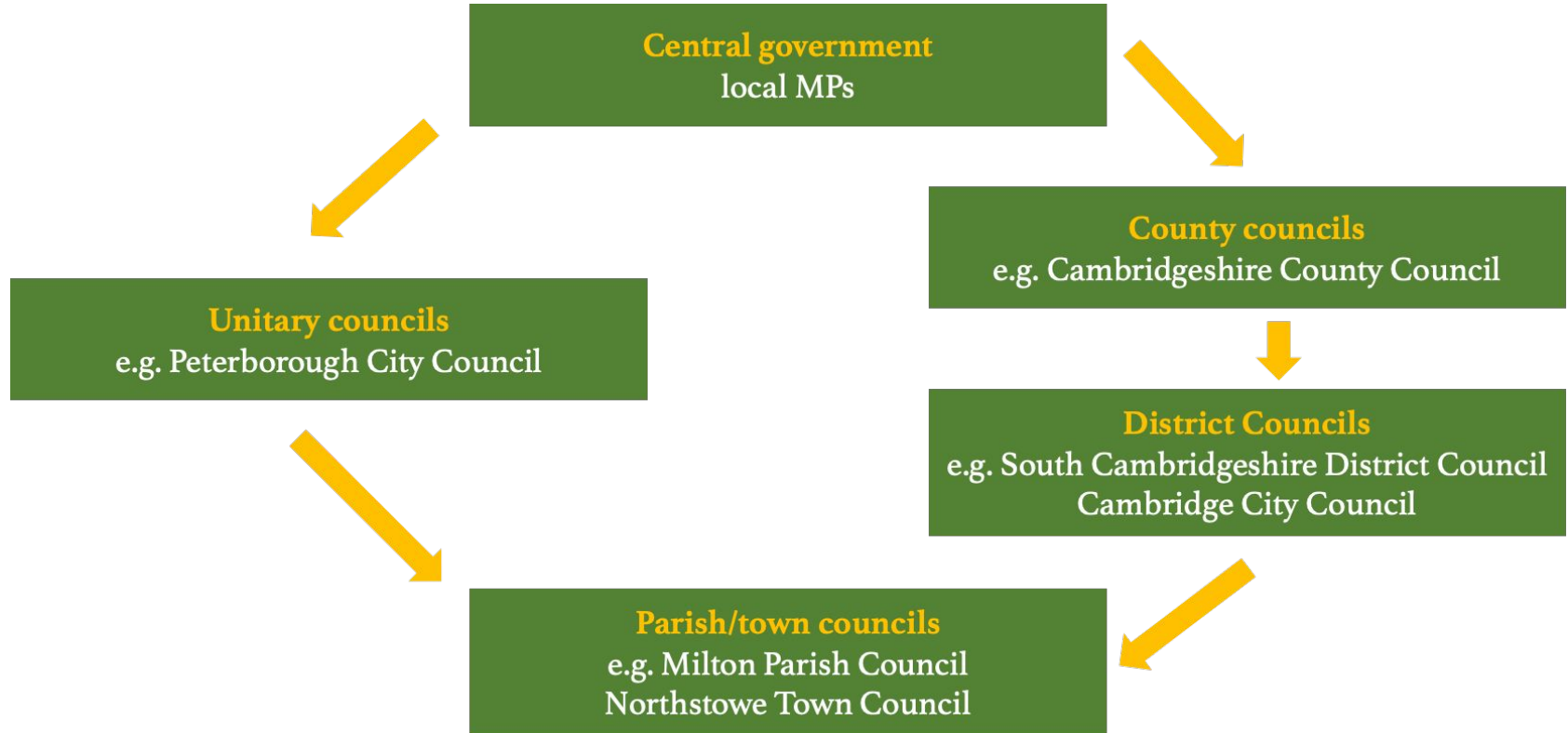
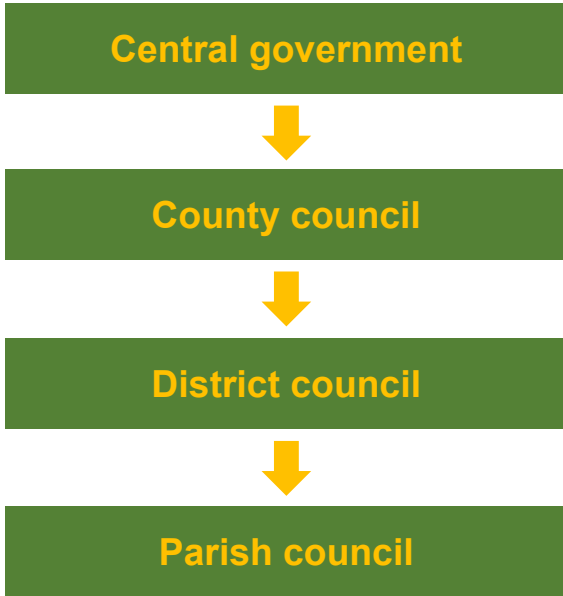


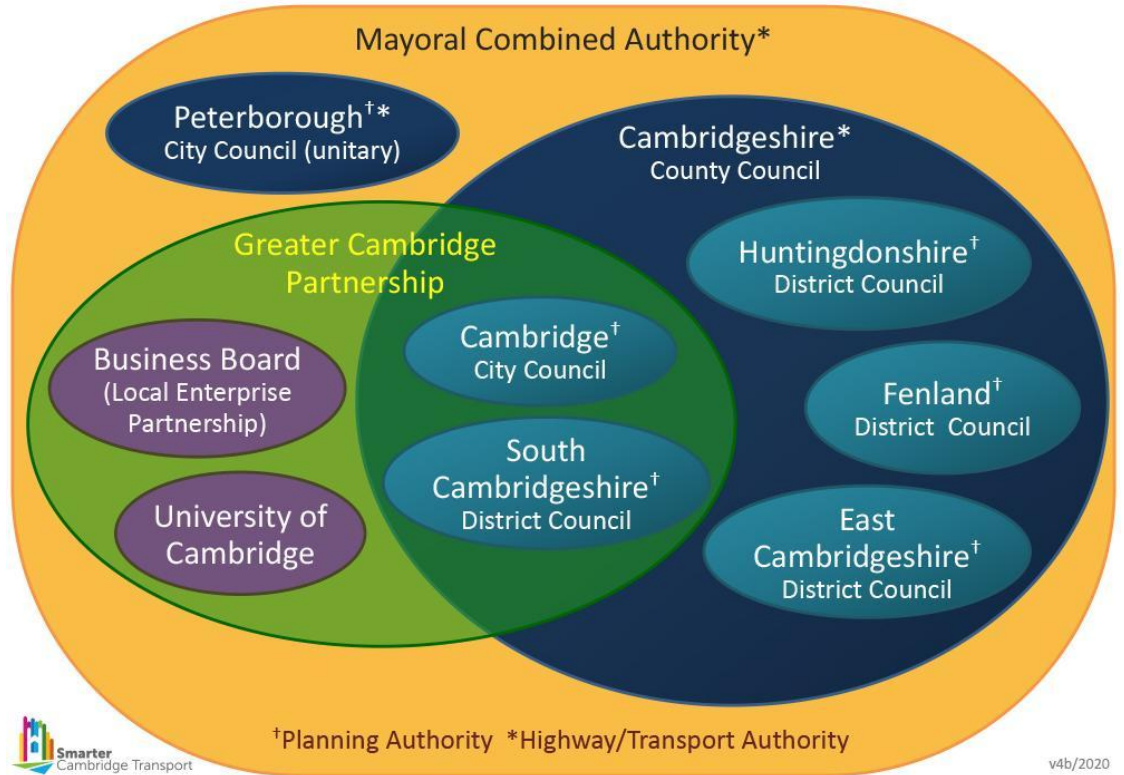

Revealed: cabinet ministers warned of legal action over UK's failure to tackle climate crisis

Senior civil servants have issued the warning as government is way behind on net zero pledges, according to leaked documents

Government should reverse cuts to active travel - LGA on active travel cut

It is very disappointing that the Government is set to cut future funding for active travel by nearly £200 million

Despite claiming to lead on the climate and nature emergencies, the Government is seeking to continue the "largest ever" road-building programme. This will increase carbon, harm nature and sever local communities. 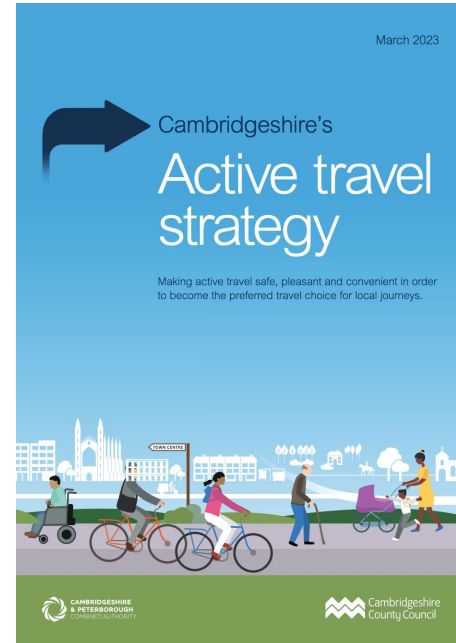

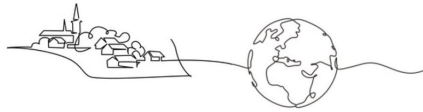
